NATIONAL CATHOLIC HEALTH CARE WEEK - OCTOBER 2-8, 2022

We will celebrate *National Catholic Health Care Week* in Canada the week of October 2-8th. This year's theme is *Building Bridges*. This week 'seeks to *build* understanding, connection and trust about our mission and contribution as a Catholic health community in Canada's pandemic response.' The *Catholic Health Alliance of Canada* (www.chac.ca) has a Tool Kit that I have attached for your use during this week of celebration. From their website, "At the heart of Catholic health care is a deep respect for the intrinsic value and dignity of every human being and an unwavering commitment to serving all people, from all backgrounds and faiths – especially society's most vulnerable." Sound familiar??? Very similar to what members of the Catholic Women's League of Canada do every day! Perhaps this would be a great week to donate blood at the many clinics that Canadian Blood Services has set up around the country. (My appointment is on October 4th!) NATIONAL BURSARY – CHANGE IN CRITERIA

The National Bursary, established in 1988 from two generous donations, is awarded each year dependent on the number of qualified applicants, the interest generated from the fund and donations received. It is used to assist members (in at least their 3rd consecutive year of membership in the League) who are pursuing courses, seminars, studies, conferences, workshops in the areas of adult faith formation, literacy tutoring, ministry to patients in palliative care, ministry to shut-ins, parliamentary procedure, youth ministry, spiritual growth. An addition has been added to the criteria: **education**

toward a nursing degree. The deadline to apply remains the same, **May 15**th. The bursary application/criteria can be found on the national website, www.cwl.ca under the 500 Series: Forms and clicking on item 552. I have also attached this form for your convenience and to pass it on to your members.
