## Resolutions

The resolution dialogue was held on August 11<sup>th</sup> in the afternoon. More than 100 delegates attended the session to review 3 proposed resolutions. Lively discussions ensued at each table and some amendments were proposed. It is inspiring to see the resolutions process at work and to be part of the making of League policy. The resolutions were brought forward on Wednesday, August 15<sup>th</sup> and all 3 resolutions passed, with some amendments. One of them came from our own province and was gifted by the Vancouver Diocese; it originated in All Saints parish in Coquitlam. Laura Wilson, the author, was on hand to speak in support of her resolution. It was passed unanimously to become part of League policy. What a proud moment for Laura and for the other ladies whose resolutions were passed.

- Resolution 2024.01: Increase Supported Housing for Individuals Experiencing Homelessness with Mental Health and Mental Illness Issues
- Resolution 2024.02: National Universal Pharmacare Program to Include Prescription Drug Coverage foe People Experiencing Mental Illness
- Resolution 2024.03 Grant the Canadian Ombudsperson for Responsible Enterprise Legal Authority to Investigate Environmental and Human Rights Abuses

Each of these resolutions addresses very timely issues affecting Canadians today. The first one came from Manitoba, the second from Quebec and 2024.03 was from our own province of BC. Please check the website for the updated copies of the new resolutions and encourage your members to follow up on the proposed action plans.

## **Euthanasia Prevention Coalition Webinar**

On August 30<sup>th</sup> @ 2PM EST, EPC will be hosting a webinar entitled: *The Rise of Euthanasia in Canada: From Exceptional to Routine*. The webinar will feature Alex Schadenberg, Rebecca Vachon and Alexander Raikin. Rebecca Vachon is the Health Program Director with Cardus and Alexander Raikin is a visiting Fellow in Bioethics at the Ethics and Public Policy Center. Cardus published Raikin's research report on the rapid rise of euthanasia in Canada on August 7<sup>th</sup>. The EPC Blog noted that the panel will discuss this report and will "look at the increase in the number of euthanasia deaths, how the law doesn't reflect the law's original intent, the lack of oversight of the law, and the lack of effective reporting of the law."
